She was married shortly after her 21st birthday. But she had little time to prepare for a life of obedience, a life of submitting to her husband “as to the lord” and less time to regret the fact that she had not led a chaste life. The wedding night would seal her fate. After three days of fearing that her husband had reported her, two sheriffs showed up at the front door. Unable to prove she was a virgin, she was put in solitary confinement, then convicted and executed for her carnal sins. At the public execution, the men of the city stoned her and neighbors and strangers came to watch, clutching their bibles. Some even took photographs so they could show others how God’s law had been carried out.
